REMEMBRANCE DAY




The Remembrance Day Ceremony will be held on Thursday, November 7 at 10:30 a.m. for grade 5 to 12 students only.

NO STONE LEFT ALONE



Hugh Sutherland School Grade 5 students have partnered with the Town of Carstairs to take part in the No Stone Left Alone program. No Stone Left Alone (NSLA) provides students with an authentic leadership experience centered around a uniquely moving, hands-on act of remembrance - laying a decorative stone at the headstones of veterans. This personal act signals respect and gratitude for our fallen military veterans, while honoring living veterans, serving members, and their families. Working closely with Bylaw Officer Arlene Andrews and Constable Walkey, students will research local veterans, personally decorate the stones, and then visit the Carstairs Cemetery to place the stones and give their respects. Students and staff will provide an update on the experience at our school's Remembrance Day ceremony on November 7.

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

APOP @ HSS!

We are excited to share that the Grade 12s at HSS are working through the Alberta Postsecondary Options Project.

The Alberta Government asked the Social Research and Demonstration Corporation (SRDC) — a non-profit research organization created in 1991 specifically to develop, field test, and rigorously evaluate new programs — to develop a project to test new approaches to increase the proportion of the province's high school students accessing postsecondary education (PSE).

For this project, SRDC has developed an online PSE decision-making tool to be piloted for Grade 12 students in a limited number of high schools. The pilot also adds replicable additional features, including workshops on the tool and the waiving of PSE application fees, to determine the extent to which these enhance the use of the tool and, hence, its effectiveness in increasing PSE access. The APOP tool and its additional features will only be piloted for one year.

The goal is for the results to guide the province in developing an optimal strategy for developing and delivering this type of decision-making tool in the future.

The website has various tools to support students' decision-making, including a guide to navigating Apply Alberta, a student aid calculator, and other budgeting tools to help students visualize how they can finance their postsecondary journey.

All Grade 12 students at HSS, will also be able to have one application paid for to any approved Alberta Postsecondary institute.
